SDGs (Agenga): Outreach & Engagement

Content Story :

There is an increasing number of adolescents having premature sex and having unprotected sex. resulting in problems such as teenage pregnancy legal and illegal abortions, and a growing trend of sexually transmitted infections This underscores the need to accelerate efforts to actively and consistently promote condom use in late childhood and adolescence to prevent degenerative problems from unprotected sex.

Target Audience: Students aged 10-15 years old in the Office of Basic Education Area Zone 3, Nakhon Si Thammarat, totaling 738 individuals from 5 schools.

Objectives: To provide knowledge on the correct use of condoms with confidence for the prevention of HIV infection sexually transmitted disease including preventing unplanned pregnancy in females.

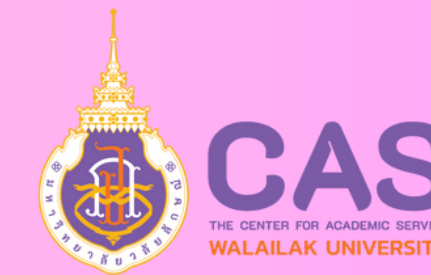

Outcome of the Project:

Building a positive image about sex and condoms of most students had an image that parents and guardians should teach their children about safe sex, 83.86 percent of them using condoms made them happy in sex. Relatively less, at least 37.26, indicating that students already have a positive image of this subject. Parents and teachers should be able to teach sex education to their students.

The students had their beliefs and behaviors about sex and condoms. Most believe that adolescents have unmarried sex is wrong. If they love each other and prevent pregnancy or sexually transmitted diseases by using condoms, 70.74 percent
