SDGs (Agenga): Outreach & Engagement

Content Story :

Currently, teenagers engage in sexual activities before the appropriate age and have unprotected sex, resulting in issues such as teenage pregnancies, abortion, and a rising trend of sexually transmitted infections. This highlights the necessity to accelerate efforts in promoting consistent and serious condom use.

Target Audience: Students aged 10-15 years old in the Office of Basic Education Area Zone 2, Nakhon Si Thammarat, totaling 1,300 individuals from 13 schools.

Objectives: To provide knowledge on positive communication, proper condom usage for the prevention of HIV infection, sexually transmitted diseases, and family planning.

Outcome of the Project:

A total of 50 student leaders have developed positive communication skills related to condom usage, as per the set goal. Among them, 53 individuals were able to put these skills into practice, achieving a percentage of 106.

Students possess sound knowledge and a positive attitude towards using condoms to prevent HIV infection and sexually transmitted diseases, with an 80 percent rate.

The students have shown a significant improvement in their attitudes, becoming more positive. Consequently, it is essential to organize a learning process that enables students to continue gaining accurate knowledge about sexuality and proper condom usage. Furthermore, both parents and teachers should engage in teaching sex education to students and approach the topic with an open-minded attitude, allowing students to naturally comprehend this matter.
