Content Story

Condom Positive Communication are important in preventing sexual problems among adolescents.

The objective is to provide students aged 10-15 years in the Nakhon Si Thammarat Primary Educational Service Area Office 4, all 28 schools, with prevention knowledge, including positive communication, condoms and natural sexual behavior. Encourage open sexual dialogue, adjust perspectives, communicate sexuality, prevent infectious diseases, and reduce unintended pregnancies.

Operating under Walailak University (School of Nursing, Walailak University Hospital, Division of Student Affairs, Walailak University: Smile & Smart Center and 12 schools in WU) and affiliated networks with Path2Health Foundation, ThaiHealth Promotion, Nakhon Si Thammarat Primary Educational Service Area Office 4, schools under the jurisdiction of Primary school areas 4, Youth Institute Nakhon Si Thammarat, M-Moon Nakhon Si Thammarat and Department of Disease Control 11.



Condom positive communication consisted of the following:

1) **Preparation phase:** Find student leaders, cultivate activity leaders, and select participating schools.

2) **Implementation phase:** Develop student leadership skills and actively communicate with condoms. The implementation of student leaders in 28 schools totaling 5,812 people, received knowledge activities from a total of 71 speakers during January and March 2023.

3) **Evaluation stage:** The quantitative results show that there are condoms positive communication student leaders exceeding the target was 53 people (106 %). The knowledge and positive attitude of school students towards condoms are helpful to prevent 80%.

The qualitative results students have changed their attitudes to be more positive. New generation parents are more accepting than older generations. The school gave the opportunity for Tambon Health Promoting Hospital to play a positive role in creating a safe space for adolescents.
